Title: KEY ISSUES AND ESCALATION POINTS Name of Committee: Adults Clinical Operational Board (COB)

Summary of key messages and assurance:

The COB received the following:

- Half yearly update on Patient Experience and complaints for all services.
- Update on Cost Improvement Plans for 23/24
- Review of incidents for all areas April 2023 September 2023.
- Integrated Governance reports covering Quality, Finance, Workforce, Risks, Serious Incidents and updates on the transformation and innovation projects.

Integrated Governance Report – the COB received a detailed Integrated Governance Report updating the following:

Ambulatory Care

- Overall assurance opinions for Dynamic Health was substantial and reasonable for both iCaSH and dental services.
- **Dynamic Health** slight increase in specialist waiting list this reporting period and reduction in physiotherapy waiting list. No serious incidents or patient safety concerns. Friends and Family scores circa 97%. Internal peer review has taken place with outstanding feedback. Mandatory training 95% and appraisal levels 89%.
- **Dental Services** No serious incidents or patient safety concerns. 1 formal complaint received. Friends and Family feedback at 98.6% and overall mandatory training at 95.5%. Main challenges continue to be Dental Nurse recruitment; sickness absence and overall demand and capacity of the service
- **iCaSH** Financial position remains the biggest challenge with a significant overspend forecasted for year end, although the Board noted an improved position from last reporting period. No serious incidents or patient safety issues. Friends and Family feedback 97.76% and no formal complaints received. LARC waiting list static and PrEP waiting list reduced to 1.

Bedfordshire and Luton Adult Services

- Overall assurance for all services was reasonable.
- No SI or patient safety concerns.
- Vacancy rate across community nursing remains a focus as although reduced with international recruitment success, still too high.
- Friends and Family feedback 98% for Luton Adults and 95% for Bedfordshire Adults.
- Update on co-production activities was shared with the Board and it was noted the significant amount of work being undertaken with the voluntary sector.
- 1 formal complaint in the reporting period.
- Overall mandatory training compliance between 92% and 93% across the services.
- Diabetes service has a small waiting list for reviews at home and access to education programme. Anticipated to be cleared within 6 months.
- Service meeting all key performance indicators, however, variable performance against the different outcomes.

Escalation Points:

Matters for escalation and outcome required: No action required from the Board on any of the escalation points:

- Small number of key performance indicators; individual areas within mandatory training and variable appraisal rates across the different services. However, Board assured that plans were in place or being put in place to address.
- Significant forecast overspend across iCaSH services. However, discussions continue with commissioners and actions being taken within services to mitigate this.

Risks of 15 or above and emerging risks:

Outstanding practice and innovation for the Board to note:

- **Dynamic Health** internal peer review. The service received fabulous feedback and demonstrated outstanding delivery across all domains.
- Dental Services Providing an emergency dental service for the homeless in Peterborough working collaboratively with the Light Project and other CCS services suh as Dynamic Health and iCaSH, starting in November.
- iCaSH service wide clinical audit plan. Participation in local and national audits, evaluation and learning shared across the service to improve patient outcomes.
- Luton Adults some great examples of co-production across its diverse population and the introduction of the Admiral Nurse.
- **Bedfordshire Adults** Singing for Lung Health running a joint weekly group at the Luton Treatment Centre.

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
