### Summary of key messages:

The Partnership board received the following:

- **Provision of Children's and Young People Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing Service in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough** – the board received and discussed an update on partnership for delivering children and young people's mental health services between CPFT/CCS/Centre 33 and Ormiston Families. The new Partnership was expected to start delivering services from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021.
- **Integrated Governance Report** – the board received a detailed Integrated Governance Report updating on the following:
  - ✓ The service had seen an increase in the universal plus and universal partnership plus (safeguarding) activity arising from increase of complexity of support required. Both Trusts had safeguarding increase recorded as a risk on Datix and scored at 16 (CPFT ID: 4009 and CCS ID: 3182).
  - ✓ Contract performance – service had been working to Phase 3 of the Covid 19 service delivery plans.
  - ✓ The leadership team continued to engage with the locality teams virtually by offering monthly question and answer sessions via Microsoft teams and this was planned to continue.
  - ✓ Recruitment – active recruitment continued during the reporting period.
  - ✓ The Best Start in Life Strategy work continued to be prioritised and the 3 place based pilot areas in Peterborough, Wisbech and Cambridge City continued to work forward with the identified work streams.
  - ✓ The board welcomed the idea of including celebratory messages in the report.

  - ✓ The service had seen an increase in Universal Partnership Plus (safeguarding) activity. Both Trusts had safeguarding increases recorded as a risk on Datix and scored at 16 (CPFT ID: 4009 and CCS ID: 3182).
